**FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTIONS: 21<sup>st</sup> Sunday:** One of the questions put to religious teachers in Jesus's time concerned the number of persons (many or few?) who will be saved, that is, those who will share in the great banquet of God's kingdom. In today's gospel Jesus is asked the question, 'Sir, will there be only a few saved?' Jesus does not answer that question. Instead, he issues a series of sayings and parables that emphasised the difficulty involved in entering God's Kingdom and he stresses the need for constant fidelity and vigilance throughout our lives. Thus, Jesus reminds us that even though God wants all of us to be saved, we all need to work at it. Entry into God's Kingdom is not automatically granted, and so we cannot presume on God's mercy and do nothing by way of response to God's invitation. Will only a few persons be saved? The answer to that question remains hidden with God. The two great attributes of God in the Bible are justice and mercy. Which will prevail at the last judgement depends on God. Today's excerpt from Luke 13 affirms that God wants all persons to enjoy eternal life with him. And it reminds us that entry into God's Kingdom is not automatic. Rather, it requires faith in God, firmness of purpose and sharpness of focus and appropriate actions and constant vigilance. While the invitation to God's banquet is extended to all, we have to act upon it. How many will be saved in the end is a decision that rests with God.

22<sup>nd</sup> Sunday: Banquet scenes are frequent in the Bible. Jesus used meals shared with all kinds of persons as occasions to impart his wise teachings. Banquets are especially prominent in Luke's gospel. The two teachings in today's reading belong to the category of wisdom teachings about God's Kingdom. Jesus's first wise teaching looks like shrewd and even calculating behaviour at a wedding banquet. If you are only a distant relative or friend of the bride or groom, you should not sit yourself at the head of the table. The chances are that someone will come by and inform you that you belong at the back of the hall. How embarrassing it will be for you. A wiser strategy would be to seat yourself first at the back. Then if by chance you are summoned to the head table, all the other guests will see you and conclude that you must be very important indeed. On the surface this advice may seem to be at best practical wisdom. On the theological level, however, it is Jesus's reminder that the banquet in God's Kingdom is not for the rich and powerful only. Rather, it is especially for the humble, that is those who recognise that in comparison with God we are all poor and insignificant. Jesus promises that such persons will be exalted. Jesus's second teaching is about who should be invited to your house for dinner. On the surface, it may not seem very wise at all. He tells his host to invite marginal persons to his house. According to most practical human wisdom, it would be wiser to invite to your house those who might be able to benefit you in the future. By suggesting that the leading pharisee should invite those who could not benefit him at all (at least in this life), Jesus challenges the Pharisee (and us) to examine why we do what we do and what we really believe about life after death. Do we do good deeds to get a good reputation or to benefit materially? Or do we believe enough in the resurrection and the divine judgement to leave the rewards for our good deeds to the justice and mercy of God?
