FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTIONS: 7th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Love of enemies is among Jesus's most distinctive, characteristic and difficult teachings. Most of us have a hard enough time loving our family and friends, or even loving ourselves. But to do good to those who hate us, bless those who curse us and pray for those who mistreat us seems to go beyond our ordinary human powers. And that is the point of today's selection from Luke's sermon on the Plain. Jesus offers two reasons why we should love our enemies: It may be wise to do so on the human level and in doing so we imitate the example of God. Our baser human instincts may tell us that enemies are to be confronted, defeated and destroyed. And so in our world there is a seemingly endless cycle of violence and retaliation. A hits B, B hits back at A, A hits B again and so on. In the end either A or B, or most likely A and B, are left exhausted and destroyed. We see this cycle played out between small children and great nations and everything in between. But what happens when someone interrupts this cycle of violence and retaliation and makes an attempt at reconciliation? That dynamic is illustrated today's first reading when David passes up an opportunity to kill his enemy, King Saul. Jesus also pushes us to go beyond reciprocity and self-interest to imitating our heavenly Father. In loving our enemies we follow the example of God who is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Jesus then challenges us to be merciful just as God our Father is merciful. The challenge to imitate God's example is, of course, beyond our unaided human powers. However, Paul's letter (our second reading) tells us that through his resurrection Jesus has poured forth his Spirit upon the world offering us the possibility of going beyond our human powers and sharing in his divine life (grace). As baptized Christians, we hope for and already share in the life-giving Spirit that flows from Christ's resurrection.

8th Sunday in Ordinary Time: There is an old maxim in philosophy that "actions flow from being" (agere sequitur esse in Latin). The idea is that who you are or become will shape what kinds of actions you do. If you are wise and righteous, you will generally act accordingly. If you are foolish and wicked, the chances are that you will do many foolish and wicked deeds. In our final selection from the Sermon on the Plain according to Luke, Jesus insists that the wisdom that he teaches must be put into practice. In other words, if we take Jesus as our teacher and guide, we must act in ways that are consistent with who we have become as disciples of Jesus. Jesus first identifies himself as a wise teacher (and not a blind guide) and promises that his followers when fully trained will be like him. Next he warns against so focusing on the faults of others that we neglect to look at ourselves. The word that Jesus uses for such persons is "hypocrite," a word derived from the ancient practice of actors wearing masks on stage. Such persons are "phonies." Then he uses the analogy of the tree: "There is no sound tree that produces rotten fruit, nor again a rotten tree that produces sound fruit." The key to understanding and acting upon the ethical teachings of Jesus and the other biblical writers is the old maxim, agere sequitur esse.
