FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION: Throughout the season of Lent the Scripture readings emphasize the themes of repentance, conversion and forgiveness of sins. They offer a consoling and hopeful message that we all need to hear at various times in our lives. Today's reading from Luke 13 captures the apparently double message that the Bible gives about God and us. On the one hand, we must repent and reform our lives now. On the other hand, God patiently awaits our repentance and reform, though there are limits to God's patience. Jesus makes the point about repentance and reform now when asked about two incidents that were apparently well known to him and his questioners. The cases concerned some Galileans (probably insurgents) executed by Pontius Pilate and eighteen persons killed by a falling tower. Rather than be drawn into a debate about cause and effect (and so about theodicy), Jesus takes these deaths as an invitation to us all to repent and reform here and now before it is too late. His point about God patiently awaiting our repentance and reform appears in the parable of the fig tree that repeatably fails to bear fruit. God is willing to give it (and us) more time because God does not want to give up on it (and us). Nevertheless, God's patience is not completely open-ended. On closer analysis it emerges that today's passage from Luke 13 does not really present a double message. It insists that we are called to repent and reform our lives here and now because God wants our repentance and reform. But God patiently awaits our repentance. However, we must not presume that God's patience is entirely limitless. God is both merciful and just.
