FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTIONS: Thirtieth Sunday – C: Today we consider the second part of Jesus's second instruction about prayer in Luke 18. The parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector reminds us that God hears the prayers of some surprising persons, and that we all must approach God in prayer and humility. In the Gospels the Pharisees often appear as negative characters. They are the most persistent opponents of Jesus, and he often criticises their attitudes and behaviour. In English today the word 'Pharisee' can refer to a hypocrite, someone who pretends to be devout and observant but is not so in reality. At Jesus's time and place, however, people would have heard the word 'Pharisee' differently. Many of them were in fact devout and observant. They were the progressives of the day. Of all the Jewish groups of Jesus's time, Jesus was perhaps closest to them, shared an agenda with them and sometimes agreed with them. In Jesus's time and place the tax collector in the parable would have been regarded as the opposite of the Pharisee. They were suspected of dishonesty by overcharging the people and keeping excess profits for themselves. They were also suspected of being instruments of and collaborators with the Roman occupiers. These two men went up to the temple area to pray. The Pharisee's prayer was not heard because he exalted himself, by contrast, the tax collector, whatever his failings may have been, knows who God is and who he is before God. Thus he prays sincerely, "Oh God, be merciful to me a sinner." Whose prayer does God hear? If our own prayer celebrates the justice and mercy of God, if it acknowledges our dependence on God, our sinfulness and need for God's mercy, then God will hear our prayer because it is genuine prayer made in а spirit of humility proper to us as God's creatures.

Thirty-First Sunday – C: 'Today' is a recurrent and important word in Luke's Gospel. In the story of Jesus's encounter with Zacchaeus the tax collector, 'today' occurs twice. Jesus tells Zacchaeus, "Hurry, because I must stay at your house today" and "Today salvation has come to this house." Zacchaeus's neighbours in Jericho are not so kind. Indeed they find Jesus's behaviour regarding Zacchaeus scandalous and say, "He has gone to stay at a sinner's house." The problem came with Luke's description of Zacchaeus as, "one of the senior tax collectors and a wealthy man." That description may seem innocent to us. But to people in Jesus's time it was disturbing. Tax collectors in ancient Israel collected taxes for the Roman occupiers. They bid for the contract and got to keep for themselves whatever went above their bid. For us Zacchaeus is a very attractive character. His enthusiasm to see Jesus is such that he climbs a tree in order to catch sight of him. He claims that he will be generous to the poor and honest in his business dealings. He is proud to welcome Jesus into his home. Zacchaeus is enthusiastic, generous and hospitable – a marvellous combination of human virtues. But beyond and behind all this is Zacchaeus's realisation and recognition that with the arrival of Jesus in Jericho the day of salvation is present in the 'today' of Jesus. It is the presence of Jesus that brings forth the responses of enthusiasm, generosity and hospitality from Zacchaeus the tax collector. It would be a valuable exercise for us to reflect on what makes Zacchaeus an attractive character and worthy of imitation.
