MASS ON THURSDAY 14<sup>TH</sup> DECEMBER will be at St Agnes\* as Our Lady of Pity Catholic Primary School Annexe Reception and Our Lady of Pity Annexe Preschool will be performing their nativity play at St Catherine's at 9.30am. Parishioners are very welcome to attend the nativity.

FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION: Matthew's description of John recalls the austere dress of the great prophet Elijah. The Jews believed that Elijah would return from heaven to announce the long-awaited restoration of Israel as God's kingdom. For Matthew, this expectation is fulfilled in John the Baptist. John challenges two of the ruling classes of the Jewish establishment. The Pharisees ("separated ones") were a group of particularly observant and influential Jews, respected for the faithful keeping of the Torah in everyday life. Little is known of the Sadducees ("righteous ones"). They seem to have been an elite class of priests associated with the temple in Jerusalem. The Sadducees were especially influential in matters of politics and temple administration. Matthew writes that John strikes a responsive chord in the people who have come to the Jordan River to hear him; but John has strong words for the Pharisees and Sadducees who step up for his baptism but have no intention of embracing the spirit of conversion and renewal to make their own lives ready for the coming of the Messiah. John's confrontation with the Pharisees and Sadducees previews the clash between Jesus and the Jewish leaders that will develop as Matthew's Gospel unfolds. His teachings consist of three warnings: do not imagine that merely undergoing the ritual of baptism will protect you, do not think that merely belonging to the children of Abraham (i.e.Israel) will save you, and do not waste the short time that is left.

ADVENT EXPLORE: journey with Shrewsbury Youth Mission Team towards Bethlehem this Advent season as we prepare to welcome Jesus Christ, the reason for Christmas! Thursday 14th December, 7pm at Saint Michael & All Angels, Woodchurch. We encourage all our young people who are in Year 7 or above to come, especially if you have just been confirmed, are preparing for it or just thinking about it.

ST CATHERINE'S CHRISTMAS TOY COLLECTION: Thank you! Six big bags of toys and games were collected last Sunday. All the toys will make a real difference to children living in homeless accommodation on the Wirral this Christmas.
