FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION: In the first chapter of the Fourth Gospel the Baptist is one of a string of witnesses brought forward to tell the reader who this Jesus is. John's witness is that Jesus is servant of God, Messiah, and Lamb of God. By designating Jesus as 'the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world', the Baptist may be thinking of the servant of the Lord who is compared to a lamb in Is 53: 7 - 12. (In Aramaic the noun 'talya' can mean 'servant' or 'lamb'). Or he may have in mind the Passover lamb. More than likely, the evangelist may be thinking at once of both the one and the other – he has put the death of Jesus at the time when the Passover lambs were being slaughtered. In any event, Jesus is the one who will destroy the sin that envelops humankind, by his death on the cross. The Baptist could have said that Jesus existed before him if he had regarded him as the new Elijah. For the evangelist, of course, he was with the Father from the first (1: 1 - 2). Jesus is the one on whom the spirit descended and rested – he has permanent possession of the Spirit. He will 'baptize' by sharing his spirit, the evangelist knows that the glorified Jesus bestowed the Holy Spirit (20: 22). Finally, the Baptist bore witness that Jesus is the 'Elect of God,' the servant of the Lord.

SVP writes "Many thanks to all your parishioners for their help and support which enables us to support people across Wirral with a range of services. This Christmas we were aware of around 40 families in homeless family units across Wirral. This included 67 children. Working with housing agencies we ensured that each child received a present and a pair of pjs. Local conferences are running seven Keep Warm Projects together with Birkenhead SVP Centre. There are numerous such projects across Wirral but ours are different as we recognise that people need more support at home to keep warm rather than just for a few hours a week. We therefore provide duvets, hot water bottles and flasks plus fruit and vegetables to improve people's health. We have also opened two clothes banks in Wallasey area. Parishioners at St Catherine's did a wonderful job of collecting and collating the donations."
