FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION: Matthew situates Jesus' public ministry just after John has been arrested. Jesus' preaching, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand,' continues the Baptist's call to conversion; he takes up the torch from the hand of John. Jesus summons his hearers to 'repent' (change their lives) because they had not allowed the reign of God to become effective in their lives. The expression 'kingdom of heaven' is rich in meaning. It signifies God's rule on earth, his reign in people's hearts. The kingdom is here and now present in history in that the power of evil spirits is broken, sins are forgiven, sinners are gathered into Jesus's friendship. The proclamation of the kingdom of heaven and the call to conversion were personalised by Jesus inviting Peter, Andrew, James and John to discipleship. The evangelist's description of the call is more interested in the theological aspect than in the facts. When Jesus called, all four answered immediately, leaving their nets (symbol of their earlier way of life) behind them. The creative word, meeting them in their everyday world, laid hold of them and changed their lives forever. This call of the first disciples became the model for all calls to discipleship in the Church.

SVP and their work in the community..."one school support worker told me how three children had arrived in school proudly displaying their new coats which had been provided by SVP. They were the first new clothes that they had ever had, normally everything came from charity shops. When we visited them a few days later (during the school holidays) one of the boys still had his coat on. His mother explained that he had refused to take it off. He followed us to the car telling us how much he loved us. The children had made us a lovely card. This family had been evicted from a previous home. Another very young woman with three small children was sitting on the floor of her new home as she had no furniture. Her former partner is serving a very long prison sentence. The Council had provided limited support of beds and some white goods. SVP will provide furniture and bedding. At present we do have council funding for this type of support but not enough for what people need."
