**FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION:** Sight of a leaderless crowd moves Jesus to think of the need for a mission by his disciples. The Kingdom of God has come, the last age, and the mission of bringing the good news to others, of gathering believers into his community, is part of the great final event. The need for this missionary activity is expressed with the biblical images of the flock ("sheep without a shepherd") and the harvest ("harvest is rich but the labourers are few"). Jesus gathers his twelve disciples and commissions them to do what he has been doing: performing exorcisms and healings. The number twelve evokes the image of the twelve tribes of ancient Israel and suggests that the disciples' mission is to participate in Jesus' programme for the restoration of Israel. The twelve apostles are listed in six pairs. Matthew specifies Simon (Peter) as first, since he was among the first disciples called by Jesus and serves as the spokesman for the group throughout Matthew's Gospel. He also identifies Matthew as a tax collector and presumably the same person mentioned in 9:9. Whether the second Simon in 10:4 was a Canaanite, a Zealot, or simply religiously zealous, is not clear. The description of Judas as the one who betrayed Jesus points to his actions in the events leading to Jesus' crucifixion. In commissioning the twelve apostles, Jesus tells them where to go, what to do, how to live, and how to respond to rejection. They are to avoid Gentile and Samaritan territories; the mission to all nations will come after Jesus' resurrection (28: 16 – 20). Rather, now they are to focus their energies on "the lost sheep of the House of Israel". They are to do what Jesus has been doing so far in Matthew's story: proclaiming God's kingdom (3: 2; 4:17) and healing those in need.
