FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION: Like the episode of the Samaritan woman (the Gospel last Sunday), this too, is a lesson on growth in faith. The miracle of the giving of sight to a blind man is a 'sign': Jesus thereby reveals that he is 'the light of the world'. In granting physical sight, Jesus demonstrates that by his teaching, life and personal presence he was the source of the spiritual vision which we call believing. The whole account reads like a picturesque, symbolic presentation of the way in which one comes to believe in Jesus as 'Lord'. Healed quickly of his physical infirmity, the man is the object of a gradual, spiritual illumination until, finally, he comes to faith: 'Lord, I believe'. He opened his life to the light who is Christ and recognised that in Christ God had revealed his plan for humankind. Henceforth he was as prepared to model his life on the pattern of Christ as he was to trust the physical light in his eyes. The man's faith grows as he stoutly defends Jesus against those who reject him. He becomes more and more convinced that Jesus is a true worshipper of God, he is truly a man from God. Sadly, while the blind man opens more and more to the light, the Pharisees, though they are physically sighted, become progressively more and more spiritually blind.
