FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION: The parable of the talents seems to endorse a highly capitalistic use of wealth and an unattractive image of God: a harsh man, reaping where he did not sow and gathering where he did not scatter seed (v. 24). We need to keep in mind that Jesus took parables from life as he saw it lived, without necessarily commending or reproving the behaviour described. The parable of the talents (large sums of money) insists on the importance of wise and decisive action in the present. A man going on a journey entrusts five, two and one talent, respectively, to three servants. On his return, he holds an accounting. The first two servants doubled his money, and so he praises them, entrusts them with more, and admits them to his household. But the third servant who was given only one talent buried it and made nothing more with it. So the master is angry with him, dismisses him as worthless and throws him out of his household. Jesus may have told the parable to illustrate varying human capacities in relation to God's gift of the Kingdom. Those who understand that it is the pure gift of a boundlessly generous God - to be received unearned as little children receive gifts from those who love them (19: 14) - ready themselves for its full reception by living in the free, creative way illustrated by the first two slaves. Those who are crippled by a restricted idea of God and the way God operates with human beings run the risk of missing out on the Kingdom altogether. Understood in this way, the parable does not endorse the view of the master described by the third slave. In fact, it refutes it.

THE HOLY FAMILY SISTERS OF THE NEEDY CHARITY TRUST: Thank you for your generosity last weekend in response to their appeal. The total raised by St Agnes and St Catherine's was £836.

COATS FOR KIDS FUNDRAISING APPEAL: St Catherine's is launching an appeal to raise money to buy new winter coats for the most vulnerable children on the Wirral.
