FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION: In chapter 23 Matthew takes Mark's (the first Gospel) brief denunciation of the scribes (Mark 12:38-40) and turns it into a major attack against the scribes and the Pharisees. The fact that it is addressed to the disciples is an important clue about the ultimate purpose of this speech. While obviously intended as a critique of the scribes and pharisees, it is primarily intended as instruction for the followers of Jesus. The leaders' authority as legitimate teachers is duly noted (23: 1-3) but they are condemned for the kind of failings that Jesus has denounced throughout this gospel: failure to act justly; a lack of compassion in laying heavy burdens on others; false piety and arrogant pride. In contrast to the arrogance and status-seeking of the religious leaders, Jesus presents an alternative vision for the community. No one should be called 'rabbi' or 'Father' or 'instructor' - in each instance such titles of honour and status within the community are nullified by the realisation that only God and God's Messiah (Jesus) hold such authority. Everyone else in the community is on the same basis - fellow students, brothers and sisters, fellow servants. This extraordinary portrayal of an egalitarian community is an important ingredient in Matthew's ecclesiology (i.e., understanding of church), one that echoes the spirit of the community discourse in chapter 18 where authority resided in the entire community and where leadership was to be characterised by humility, respect for others, attention to the weaker members, compassion for the stray and active forgiveness.
