FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION: The series of controversies in Matthew's Gospel is resumed with the debate about paying taxes to the Roman emperor. The opponents are Pharisees (members of a Jewish religious movement) and Herodians (supporters of the Herod dynasty). Working together, they hope to trap Jesus. If Jesus agrees with the Herodians that it is lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, he will lose prestige with the insurgents against Roman occupation. If he disagrees and sides with the Pharisees, the Roman officials and their Jewish supporters may have him arrested and punished. But Jesus eludes their trap by demonstrating that both groups use Roman coins and so are already in the Roman system. He goes on to challenge them to be as observant about fulfilling their obligations to God as they all in paying taxes to Caesar. In the debate about the greatest commandment, the opponents are Pharisees. Their question was also put to other famous Jewish teachers of the time, such as Hillel and Shammai. Jesus responds by naming two commandments: love of God (Deuteronomy 6:4-5), and love of neighbour (Leviticus 19:18). The image of the whole Law and Prophets hanging from these two commandments suggests that they provide the key to carrying out all the other 611 commandments in the Torah.
