FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION: In John 10:11-18, Jesus identifies himself as the good shepherd. The good shepherd is willing to risk his own life for the welfare of his sheep, something that a hired hand would not do. Jesus' self-sacrificing action in regard to his flock stems from an all-encompassing love. To be a member of that flock is to know oneself included among those for whom Jesus is willing to die. Moreover, as the good shepherd, Jesus desires that his sheep might enter into the mutual relationship existing between the Father and the Son. This will happen through Jesus laying down his life for "his own". Then there can be "one flock, one shepherd." The "other sheep" may refer to Jews who had not yet come to believe in Jesus or to gentiles who might yet come to learn more about Jesus from his apostles. However, after giving his life for others in his passion and death, Jesus will take it up again in his Resurrection and exaltation. By way of conclusion, Jesus insists that he does all this willingly in response to the command from his heavenly Father. As believers we know ourselves as sought out, gathered, and brought into the life-giving fold (the community of believers) by the shepherd who enacts the divine outreach of love to the world.
