FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION: On the first Sunday of Lent it is customary to read a Gospel account about the temptation of Jesus. Mark's brief narrative of the temptation of Jesus, followed by his opening proclamation, is a condensed anticipation of major themes of the Gospel. The traditional term "temptation" is inaccurate, since the original Greek means "tested" or "subjected to a trial." This evokes the wider theme of God's testing of the people of Israel and the suffering just person (for example Job), who though tested by God remains faithful and is called child of God. In this first Lenten Gospel, the Church portrays a Jesus who "because he himself was tested through what he suffered...is able to help those who are tested" (Heb.2:18). Jesus leaves the desert to proclaim the "good news," a term used in secular Greek for the public proclamation of a major event (for example a military victory). The term is also found in Second Isaiah to describe the proclamation of God's victorious return to Zion and restoration of Jerusalem. Mark is priming his readers to expect that his story will focus on the fulfilment (time being literally "filled up) of Isaiah's prophecy of the establishment of God's kingly rule. Only by following the way of Jesus through the Gospel, hearing his word, and adopting his values can a person understand more deeply the mystery of God's reign. At the beginning of the Gospel Jesus calls people to "repent." The Greek word, "metanoia," means to change your mind, to take second look at your life. Not a bad way for us to start Lent.
