FR DAVID'S GOSPEL REFLECTION: This week we continue Mark's account of a typical day in the life of Jesus. Last week we heard how Jesus could cast our demons; now he is shown to have power over sickness. There is a close connection between the two. Jews tended to think of sickness as due to demonic action. The early Christian community regarded the miracles of Jesus in a twofold light: as the manifestation of the power of God present in Jesus and as signs of redemption. In today's Gospel we hear how Simon-Peter tells Jesus that his mother-in-law is sick, then Jesus goes to her and raises her up and she is healed. The Greek text highlights the verb raise (egeiren) which connotes restoring someone to health but also means "to raise from the dead." After the healing of Simon's mother-in-law we are told that she immediately starts to serve others. At first this seems jarring. Then we realise that Mark is telling us something about how God operates in the world. When we are touched in some way by Jesus, we follow a path of conversion and, walking this way of discipleship, we feel compelled to serve others. Part of the miracle is what happens to someone after they have an encounter with Jesus. Many of us are already in serving roles. For example, some of us are parents, serving the needs of our children. Or some take care of older parents or in-laws. Many of us have careers that involve service to others. I wonder how many of us see that these actions are indeed our discipleship. It is the way we follow Jesus in our own lives.
